Message from the Chancellor

Research at the University

Doctoral Programmes: The University has gained a reputation for quality research, with 160 doctoral candidates spread over 17 departments:



- Humanities: North East India Studies, Social Work, Mass Communication, Management,
 - Language Studies, Comparative Religion, Psychology Counseling, Education
- Engineering: Electronics and Communication Engineering, Electrical and Electronics

Engineering, Computer Science & Engineering, Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering

- Basic Sciences: Physics, Chemical Science, Mathematics
- Biological Sciences: Biotechnology

The first three research scholars are on the verge of submitting their dissertations: Jose K Jacob (N E India Studies), Utpalparna Kalita (Chemical Sciences) and K M Baharul Islam (Social Work).

Projects and Collaborations: Three major research projects, from AICTE, DBT and ICAR, and over 50 publications in journals of repute in 2014, have catapulted the University to cutting edge areas of research in collaboration with leading institutions from India and abroad in areas like biotechnology, nano-sciences, medicinal chemistry, X-ray crystallography, spectral studies and engineering.

Placement Activities

With an upturn in the employment market, upscale companies like TechMahindra, TCS, General Electric and many others have given an early start to the placement season. Increasingly, there is also a pronounced trend among the students to opt for further studies or to try their hands at entrepreneurial start-ups of their own.

student exchange programme. This news came just like a bolt from the blue. I could not even believe that this could happen to me.



Dreaming at Tapesia Gardens...




