DON BOSCO HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS MEET, ENNORE



A two-day meeting of Salesian Institutions of Higher Education in India was held on 17-18 August 2009 at Don Bosco, Ennore, Tamil Nadu. The meeting was convened by Fr. Stephen Mavely, Vice-Chancellor of Don Bosco University, Guwahati, and Fr Maria Charles, National Delegate for Youth Pastoral, with a view to create a forum to get to know each other and to discuss matters of common interest, to facilitate net-working and make the congregation's involvement in higher education more visible and meaningful in the country. The heads of 31 Institutions from various parts of India participated in the two-day conference.

Fr. Maria Arokiam Kanaga, Regional Superior, in his inaugural speech lauded the members for coming together to create a network that would represent Salesian Higher Education at various national and international forums. He spoke of the need for ensuring quality, integrity and salesianity as the three characteristics that should be the hallmarks of Salesian's involvement in higher education. Fr. The renowned Dr. Pradeep Perera, Finance Specialist for South East Asia in Asian Development Bank (ADB), Manila was the resource person of the programme. Dr. Perera has the PhD from Imperial College, University of London and has the experience of working as a Task Team Leader for various projects at Sri Lanka, Vietnam, Lao PDR and United Kingdom. Fr. Joseph Nellanatt, Pro-Vice-Chancellor of Don Bosco University welcomed the resource person and briefed him of DBCET, the constituent College of the Don Bosco University that has been recently established as the first private University in Assam. He made a special note of thanks to Dr. PK Goswami, Director of Technical Education, Govt. of Assam and Dr. Anuradha Devi, Senior Lecturer of DBCET for contacting Dr. Perera for the programme. The resource person was introduced by Dr. Anuradha Devi.

Dr. Perera dealt on 'Opportunities for Engineers in Multilateral Development Banks' and spoke on 'The role of development banks', 'Asian Development Banks (ADB)', 'Expertise required for ADB', 'How does Engineers fit into Development Banks', 'What does Engineers do in ADB' and 'How does Engineers join in ADB'.

Public Key Infrastructure Outreach Programme

A seminar on 'Public Key Infrastructure (PKI), the third of the series of programmes, 'Pathways to Future: an industry-academia interaction' was held at Don Bosco College of Engineering and Technology, Azara on 25 August, 2009. Fr. Joseph Nellanatt welcomed and introduced the resource persons of the programme Mr. Dittin Andrews, Staff Scientist of C-DAC and Mr. Abhijit Kumar, Senior Technical Associate, C-DAC. The entire programme focused on cryptography and the important concepts of digital signatures which should become a practice of the day.

Mr. Dittin Andrews made a presentation on cryptography which deals with the methods of providing information security and spoke about digital signature, message encryption and decryption methods, public key, private



key and various other techniques made in order to maintain authenticity, integrity and confidentiality of information. He also described how these methods are being efficiently used for different utilities like voting, shopping, trading etc. through emails. Mr. Abhijit Kumar showed the practical implementation of the cryptographic methods by citing various examples. He explained how messages are encrypted and decrypted using public and private keys and also discussed the role of digital signature in the present day.

"Don Bosco's System... and Challenges in Higher Education"

A formative Progarmme for the Faculty of DBCET

A four-day-long formation programme for faculty on "Don Bosco's System ... and the Challenges in Higher Education", conducted by Fr. Joe Arimpoor sdb, Director of DB ARK, Delhi organized by Don Bosco University, Guwahati was held from 4-7 August, 2009 at Don Bosco College of Engineering and Technology, Guwahati. The training programme stressed on having a new look at education today, pointed out the importance of going beyond the traditional patterns and systems to accept a holistic approach to education. He shed lights on getting "insights" or the "ah-ha(s)" and how "we grow when we act on our insights".

Fr. Joe Arimpoor, with dynamism and deep knowledge, explained the components necessary for the new system of education. He commented on the present education system as

monotonous as a Banking System. He said that in this system a lot of emphasis is on memory and termed it as rote learning leading to the development of left brain only. He challenged the members to be trend-setting in terms of teaching methodologies, syllabus, courses, etc and to be focused on encouraging the analytical, critical and integral abilities found in students. He dealt at length on the evolution of the theories of intelligence. Speaking on newer pattern of teaching he said, "A good parent and educator will encourage/promote children and students to ask more and more questions." Question like "What?" "Why?" "Why not?" "How?" which eventually are signs of growth in a child/student.

The deeper insights shared on the person, Don Bosco, enthused the

participants to learn and adapt his ways to answer to the needs of the present day education. 'The Preventive System', 'Principles of Don Bosco's Educational System' and 'Qualities of a Don Bosco Educator' were the main topics dealt with. The way the resource person developed the concept on "Educate by Evangelizing" in a multireligious context was unique and well appreciated by all. The participants were led to understand the distinctiveness and relevance of Don Bosco's system of Education, which helps to bring about a holistic approach in education.

The group felt challenged looking at the higher education today in the light of Don Bosco's system which emphasizes on 'God and Eternity', 'Love and Relationship' and an 'Everpresent Educator' who is pastoral in approach.

I walked through one such doorway the other day when the AICTE and MHRD (Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India) organized a Conference at New Delhi for about 30 Vice Chancellors. The idea was to give us an exposure to a government programme in engineering education that has found worldwide acceptability: National Programme for Technology-Enhanced Learning (NPTEL). Enormous resources virtually on every engineering course

have been created by the most experienced teachers and minds in the field of technical education; and these are freely available to anyone who cares to use them downloadable lectures and videos at http://nptel.iitm.ac.in and at http://www.youtube.com/iit. It is well on the way to becoming the largest video repository of technical lecture-courses in the world in the streaming video format.

These courses (we went through a few of them)have been built on the modular model, largely adhering to the course structures recommended by the AICTE and leading universities, and so it is possible for staff and students alike to find lectures that suit their particular needs taught by the best teachers in the country. In many ways they are similar to and superior to the 'Open Courseware by Massachusetts Institute of Technology (OCW) available at http://www.ocw.mit.edu

As this doorway opens, here is what we are doing at DBCET. 1) We have just placed an order for the entire set of video lectures that are available now. 2) We intend to load them on our networked computers in the computing centre and the language lab (about 120 computers in all) where you can have access to them at will. 3) The entire teaching staff at DBCET has gone through an orientation programme on use of NPTEL at IIT(Gauhati) a fortnight ago, and have already started using them in the classroom to supplement their lectures.

Let us hope that this doorway will help to propel DBCET in its single minded pursuit to become a centre of excellence in engineering education.

And taking a wider view... Each doorway is a chance to lead a better and happier life. Those that can identify these doorways and muster up the courage to pass through them can create real change in their lives.

But first we must recognize that the doorway is there. So, why not spend a few moments today to Identify some doorway moments in your life? Here at Don Bosco University, we will be happy to hold the door for you as you walk through.
