Report on World Environment Day Celebration, 5th June 2024

Program Highlights:

Dr. Abhinandan Saikia, Assistant Professor, TISS Guwahati delivered a session on *Environmental Sustainability and Plastic Waste Reduction*, while Mr. Anabil Goswami (Co-Founder, Arohan Foods Pvt. Ltd.) spoke on *Sustainable Business Practices*. A live demonstration and display of eco-friendly products by **Elrhino Paper** highlighted innovative approaches to sustainability using elephant and rhino dungbased handmade paper. This was followed by an **Environmental Awareness Exhibition** curated by student members of the Environment Club. A major **Tree Plantation Drive** was conducted across Azara Campus, Careno Complex, Girls' Hostel Campus, and the adopted village of Keotpara, supported by WWF Assam & Arunachal, ARJB Farms, and Assam Climate Change Management Society. ARJB Farms contributed 45 saplings including species like Chandan, Agaru, and Bokul. The event concluded with a vote of thanks acknowledging all contributors and participants. The World Environment Day Celebration was organized by the NSS Unit of Azara Campus in collaboration with the Department of Management, Environment Club, ARJB Farms, and Assam Climate Change Management Society.
