Programme Highlights:

The Training of Trainers (ToT) session for the Cyber Smart Heroes Programme was conducted via Zoom in collaboration with Child Rights and You (CRY), Kolkata. Mr. Saptarshi Hazra, Senior Manager – Volunteer Action, CRY began by explaining the critical role of cyber security in today's digital landscape, particularly for children. He introduced the programme framework, including pre- and post-assessment formats for student participants, and discussed legal aspects and internet safety practices through engaging visuals and animations. An open discussion followed, allowing volunteers to ask questions and clarify concepts. The session concluded with the finalization of the next step, which involves the trained volunteers visiting schools to carry out cyber safety awareness activities. The programme ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Ranjita Chanda, NSS Programme Officer.
